Electrification of our Parks: Powering Parks for a Greener Future

As the world strives for cleaner energy solutions, parks are emerging as key spaces for electrification. Our focus is to reduce carbon footprints and enhance visitor experiences. Our Parks are central to our quality of life and electrifying them supports sustainability goals. It reduces reliance on fossil fuels, improves air quality, and sets an example with an eco-friendly infrastructure. We are currently developing a plan to convert the infrastructure of our existing facilities to 100% renewable energy. We intend to start with the Lodge at Bailie Beach and then apply a similar strategy at Veterans Beach.

- Phase #1 Bailie Beach Lodge
 - Installation of Solar Panels to support all facility energy needs
 - Replace existing Oil heating system with new electric Heat Pumps
 - Heat Pumps provide needed Air Conditioning
 - Solar-powered lighting for trails and facilities
 - Electrified maintenance equipment replacing gas-powered tools
- Benefits for Residents
 - Lower emissions and cleaner air
 - Reduced/eliminated grid dependence
 - Cost savings over time through renewable energy
 - Enhanced safety and reliability


HUGS provides prevention education strategies aimed at reducing high-risk behaviors among our youth while fostering positive attitudes to improve all areas of life.

We successfully migrated our website to .Gov while straightening out some tech issues. We're faced with a new challenge at Aldrich Lane Fields and our Love Lane property. Water testing revealed contamination in their water supplies. Suffolk County Water will hook up Love Lane for free; we are working with the county on treatment options for Aldrich Lane Fields.

Facilities Update: Upcoming RFPs

Like many small municipalities, the MPD relies on outside contractors for certain aspects of our facilities operations. Jobs that require specialized equipment or more manpower are bid out to local companies.

This month we are requesting proposals for landscaping, irrigation, and plumbing contracts. A complete RFP package for each is available at the main office. Prospective bidders will have to walk through our properties with the Facilities Manager to get the full scope of each project. There is obviously some overlap between the facilities crew and contractors. While the landscape contractors mow and trim the lawns of the parks, you will still see the MPD crew weeding, trimming

The facilities crew will still be dealing with the day-to-day leaks and plumbing repairs, but shutting down and winterizing half a dozen seasonal restrooms and servicing water heaters is something to leave to the pros.

branches, and tending to flower beds.

Ideas we are currently considering include:

- <u>Bay Ave:</u> A kayak launch, minor additional plantings, the removal of phragmites to expose the water view, and the relocation/recreation of the tennis courts;
- <u>Bailie Beach Lodge</u>: Solar, air conditioning, bathroom upgrades, and parking improvements; (imagine comfortably holding an event there in August!);
- Breakwater Beach: Playground upgrades.
- · Aldrich Lane: Pickleball.
- Veterans Beach: A pavilion
- · Love Lane: A new dock and kayak launch
